



RODENTICIDE POLICY

Guiding Eyes does not permit Rodenticides (mouse and rat poisons) to be present anywhere in a puppy raiser's home or property.

These products can lead to life-threatening bleeding and hemorrhage if your dog ingests even a small amount of the product.

Rodenticides are tasty in order to attract rodents, but that makes them attractive to dogs as well. Signs of rodenticide toxicity often go unrecognized. Symptoms of rodenticide poisoning often do not show up for several days (and may include internal bleeding), so puppy raisers may not be aware the puppy has been exposed. Internal bleeding may initially go unnoticed even by the veterinarian.

There is no safe place for these chemicals in your home. Dogs are very good at getting behind furniture or into cabinets where raisers have placed these baits, assuming it was not accessible to the dog.
